### ✈ Day 1 • Las Vegas

Welcome to fabulous Las Vegas! Guests who book their air through YMT will be greeted by a YMT representative and transferred to their hotel. The night is yours to enjoy this city. Just outside your hotel's doorstep await neon lights, the famed Fremont Street Experience, gambling or glamorous shows. The choice is yours!

### 🚌 Day 2 • Grand Canyon

Start your tour with the grandest of all parks in the West — the Grand Canyon! Travel via I-40, cross historic Route 66 and stop at the first viewpoints driving into the park before we end the day by the South Rim. You will stay the night inside the park, where the park shuttle system and the lodge's close proximity to the rim make it easy to take it all in at your own pace and allow you to witness sunset and sunrise if you choose—truly a "must see!" The evening and the sunset, making the canyon glow in many hues of red and purple, is yours to enjoy!

### 🚌 Day 3 • Page/Lake Powell via Monument Valley

Rise early to witness an unforgettable sunrise over the canyon, either by walking to the rim

on your own or booking an optional tour with sunrise breakfast at the famed El Tovar Lodge. Then, head to Monument Valley. Boasting natural sandstone masterpieces that tower to heights up to 1,000 feet, this sacred valley is owned and operated by the Navajo Nation. After an optional opportunity for a guided valley tour in open air vehicles, continue to Page at Lake Powell for an overnight stay. Supported by the Glen Canyon Dam, Lake Powell is a beautifully situated water reservoir on the Colorado River, surrounded by red rocks.

### 🚌 Day 4 • Bryce Canyon via Zion National Park

Depart this morning heading west to Zion National Park. The half-mile deep park floor is lush with foliage, as well as mule deer, wild turkeys, gray foxes and the occasional porcupine. After lunch, continue to Bryce Canyon. Despite its name, Bryce is not a canyon but a collection of giant natural amphitheaters. Its distinctive geological structures, called hoodoos, were formed by frost weathering and stream erosion from the river. Standing at the rim, you are offered spectacular views in red, orange and white that will surely be spellbinding.

**Days 5 & 6 • Arches & Canyonlands**

Traveling northeast you will first pass through Capitol Reef National Park. Then head to Moab, the ideal gateway for a visit to both Arches and Canyonlands National Park. For the past 150 million years, the more than 2,000 natural sandstone arches of Arches National Park have been sculpted by the natural erosion of wind, water, sun, and frost — creating an unmistakably unique landscape. You will also explore Canyonlands National Park, an outdoor wonderland of enchanting vistas carved by the Colorado and Green rivers.

**Day 7 • Salt Lake City**

Relax during a day of leisurely driving through beautiful mountain ranges on your way to Salt Lake City, Utah’s capital and home of the spectacular Temple and Mormon Tabernacle. Upon arrival you will enjoy an included panoramic tour of the city.

**Day 8 • Elko**

Continue west with a stop at the Great Salt Lake. The largest salt water lake in the western hemisphere, its size varies dramatically by several thousand square miles in different weather conditions. Next, admire the Bonneville Salt Flats. This barren white area was once a lake, and is now a famous site for land speed records.

**Days 9 & 10 • Lake Tahoe Area**

This morning continue to majestic Lake Tahoe, the largest alpine lake in the U.S. with 72 miles

of pristine shoreline, and historic Virginia City. Known as the home of the Comstock Lode, the city invites you to wander a bit on the trusty wooden sidewalks and see this real life “Bonanza” before returning to the hotel for a night at leisure in Reno.

**Day 11 • Yosemite National Park**

Entering California, you will spend most of the day visiting one of the crown jewels in the National Park system: Yosemite. This diverse land, with elevations ranging from 2,000 to over 13,000 feet, abounds with spectacular granite cliffs, giant waterfalls, and towering trees.

**Day 12 • Sequoia & Kings Canyon National Park**

Enjoy panoramic vistas as you explore the sister parks of Kings Canyon and Sequoia National. See the ancient giant Sequoia redwoods, the largest trees in the world, in General Grant Grove, with heights above 300 feet and diameters of more than 20 feet! Enjoy vistas of the forest as your coach meanders through Kings Canyon and stop for a picnic break. Overnight in Bakersfield.

**Days 13 & 14 • Las Vegas via Death Valley/ Depart Home**

Head back to Nevada through ever changing landscapes from farmlands to desert landscapes. If temperature permits, you will head through Death Valley, the lowest point of elevation in North America and home to

fantastic rock formations, a befitting end to the truly great collection of National Parks visited on this tour. On Monday, bid farewell to your newfound friends and depart for home.

# YMT VACATIONS TERMS & CONDITIONS

## GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS

\*Prices are per person in USD based on double occupancy and apply to new bookings only; single supplements apply. For packages that include a cruise component, pricing is based on the lowest cabin category; upgrades are available at an additional cost. Pricing does not include taxes or round trip airfare, which is available. Seasonal surcharges apply to airfares, please ask your Travel Consultant for latest fares from your home city. Additional airline checked baggage fees may apply and are not included in the airfares quoted.

All sightseeing mentioned during port visits is optional, subject to change, and available as part of a shore excursion program at an additional cost. Any optional tours mentioned may change without notice and cannot be confirmed until final documents are mailed.

## RESERVATIONS AND PAYMENTS

Tour prices are based on double occupancy. Tour prices are based on rates and tariffs in effect at the time of printing and YMT reserves the right to adjust prices in the event of a change therein.

Early reservations and non-refundable deposits are essential to securing space. Deposit schedules are for program costs only and follow these terms:

- A non-refundable deposit (first deposit) of \$250 per person is due at the time of reservation
- A second non-refundable deposit (second deposit) of \$250 per person is required 180 days prior to departure
- Payment of the balance (final payment) is due at YMT Vacations 90 days prior to departure

If you make your reservation after the final balance is due, full payment will be collected at the time of booking and your payment is subject to the non-refundable deposit requirements. Programs with special events may require additional deposits.

Failure to submit final payment by the above noted deadlines may result in automatic cancellation of space and forfeiture of

non-refundable deposits. If payment is not received in time, YMT Vacations will not be responsible for lost reservations and/or additional cost to reinstate bookings with airlines, cruise companies and other suppliers. Payments can be made by credit card (Visa, MasterCard & Discover), check, money order or cashier's check. All payments must be made in USD (\$). Payment is not considered made until it is received by YMT.

## CHANGES AND CANCELLATIONS

**Name changes** - No name changes can be made. In order to change participants, your original reservation must be canceled and a new reservation made reflecting the correct configuration of guests. Any nonrefundable deposits paid on the original account will not apply to the new booking; the new reservation made will be subject to normal non-refundable deposit requirements.

## TOUR PACE AND DISABILITIES

YMT Vacations' programs vary in pace, but in general, they require guests to be in good physical and mental health. YMT will make reasonable efforts to accommodate the special needs of its travelers; however, such travelers should be aware that the Americans with Disabilities Act is inapplicable outside of the United States. Facilities outside the United States for disabled individuals are limited.

Accordingly, when you reserve your package, please inform YMT of any physical disabilities or limitations so that we can help you determine the appropriateness of the itinerary you select. Notwithstanding the foregoing, YMT reserves the right to decline to accept or retain on any trip any person as a passenger should such person's health or mental condition or physical infirmity or general deportment impede the operation of the trip or affect the rights, welfare, health, safety or enjoyment of other passengers. Refund of unused land services is the limit of YMT's liability in such an event. It is the guest's responsibility to judge the appropriateness of these travel activities to their physical capabilities. At times, vendors with whom YMT contracts may require a doctor's release to travel for travelers of a certain age or with special disabilities.

YMT Vacations regrets that it cannot provide individual assistance for walking, eating, or other personal needs. Anyone needing assistance in this manner must be accompanied by a companion.

## AIRLINE TICKETS

Where guests elect to book airfare with YMT, airline tickets are issued after guests are paid in full. All airline requests must be in our office at a minimum 90 days prior to the tour departure date. Requests can never be guaranteed and additional fees may apply. The best routing is booked based upon the availability of the airlines at the time of issuing air tickets. Non-stops and direct flights are not always available and may require additional charges. Flights are booked at YMT's discretion to best align with meet & greet and transfer times. After tickets have been issued, there are airline imposed penalties to make any changes or upgrades. Guests are responsible for any imposed penalties when requesting itinerary changes.

## CRUISE CABIN ASSIGNMENTS

Individual cabin assignments are made by the cruise line closer in to or up to the actual sail date based on names reported. The deck location (high/low) and position of the cabin within the deck (bow, stern, port, starboard) depend on category and type of stateroom booked. Cruise lines may upgrade passengers at no additional charge at their discretion. When multiple cabins are booked, YMT endeavors to keep the linked rooms in proximity of each other. Final cabin assignments are done by each cruise line's reservation unit and are subject to change YMT is therefore unable to guarantee adjoining or adjacent location, especially when the cabins are in different categories.

## CONSUMER PROTECTION

YMT shares the coverage available under the USTOA \$1 Million Travelers Assistance Program with affiliates of the Travelopia group who, as active members of the USTOA are required to post a \$1 Million letter of credit with the USTOA. This amount is to be used to reimburse, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the USTOA Travelers Assistance Program, the advance payments of YMT customers. Further, you should understand that the \$1 Million letter of credit posted may be sufficient to provide only a partial recovery of the advance payments received by YMT.
