Pardoning a turkey by a President of USA is believed to have begun with President Abraham Lincoln in 1863, although historians doubt it. Presidents John F. Kennedy and President Richard Nixon appeared to spare turkeys at some point during their times in office, but it wasn't until President Ronald Reagan's term in 1981 that sending a turkey to a farm became the norm. President George H.W. Bush formalized the presidential pardon and, as has become the tradition, sent the turkey to a children's petting zoo/farm.
