Technology Resources for Older Adults

Connection with others is key to our wellbeing. According to the University of Michigan's National Poll on Healthy Aging*, in June of 2020 more than half (56%) of older adults reported feeling isolated from others, compared to just 27% in 2018. In the winter season, when Michigan weather strikes, there can be a large emphasis on taking these social interactions online. This can prove to be a bit of a barrier for older adults, and understandably so, there are many websites, devices, and applications to navigate when trying to use technology. We've put together a list of some of the top resources that can help.



Signs of Isolation Assessment

The AARP Foundation offers a free Connect 2 Affect online assessment to measure social isolation. This can be taken by or on behalf of an individual, it involves a series of 10 questions and offers resources depending on the answers provided. Visit www.connect2affect.org

GetSetUp Michigan

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services partnered with GetSetUp, a digital education platform for older adults, to offer 150+ technology and enrichment classes. What is unique is that these classes are taught by their peers, retired educators, and in addition to how to use certain technology classes, GetSetUp also offers interest groups and social hours for older adults. https://www.getsetup.io/partner/michigan

Older Adults Technology Services (OATS) and Senior Planet

In this OATS and AARP partnership, their most important finding is the enormous number of American seniors – an estimated 21.8 million – who still do not have broadband access to the internet. They recognize the need for internet access across the US and sought to partner with telecommunications companies, nonprofits, and public entities to bring low-cost internet options to older adults nationwide. Tax Preparation for Seniors 2025 At Scottville Area Senior Center

Scottville Area Senior Center (SASC) is pleased to announce that Don Ferenz has offered to do tax returns at the senior center again this year for our seniors. In addition, for the 2025 tax season, John Herzog has offered to help Don.

Don will have appointments on Tuesday mornings, beginning January 28th, at 9:15, 10:00, 10:45 and 11:30. John will have appointments on Wednesday afternoons, beginning January 29th, at 12:30, 1:15, 2:00 and 2:45. Both will continue appointments through the end of March.

Don and John will assist those with the most limited incomes at no charge, and with extremely reasonable fees for others who seek their help.

Don has sent a letter to all the seniors who previously had their tax returns done at SASC in 2024. He asks that everyone return the clip-off form in the stamped envelope he provided, indicating whether or not they want help again this year. Those who had tax returns done through SASC last year will have first crack at 2025 appointments.



Ask Sharon

Now that the holiday season is past, it's time to get back to business as usual. I hope your Christmas and New Year's were all you hoped they'd be. We'd all love to see you at the Senior Center, whether it is for lunch or some of the activities going on. January is usually a slow month for seniors, but a perfect time to get acquainted with the senior center. If you have a problem with your Medicare Advantage plan now is the time to check it out.

Breaking News

If you haven't read about changes to Medicare yet, please be advised that Priority Health and some other plans have added a deductible to your health care.

So, if you go to your doctor or go in for any other health care you will have to pay a deductible before insurance kicks in. The deductibles are anywhere from \$195 to \$500 a year. Please read the inside cover of your plans book that you received to see if this will affect you.

Starting after the first of the year you can still change Medicare plans through March. Call me if you want me to check your plan. 757-4052 is my number.

- Q. I heard that there is a new Medicare Advantage enrollment in January.
- A. Yes there is open enrollment for Medicare Advantage from January 1 through March 31, with your new plan going into effect the on the first of the following month after you enroll.
- Q. What can you do during this time?
- A. 1. You can change from your old Medicare Advantage plan to a new plan. If you want to make sure you have the best plan for your needs I can compare plans for you.
 - 2. You can drop your Medicare Advantage plan and return to original Medicare and a drug plan.
 - 3. You cannot switch from Original Medicare to a Medicare Advantage plan.
- 4. You also cannot change your drug plan or join a drug plan for first time at this time. Drug plans can only change during drug plan open enrollment in the fall.
